



National Capital Consortium Pediatric Residency Program Resident Schedules



Resident Schedules are designed to meet the educational requirements set by the ACGME Pediatrics RRC and specific program requirements.

The residency operates in a block system with 13 blocks per year. The first block is 3 weeks in length. Block 7 is 5 weeks in length and includes a winter holiday liberty period. All other blocks are 4 weeks in length.

Block 1 begins on July 1st. Blocks begin on a Friday for PGY2/3 residents, and on the following Monday for PGY1 residents. Block 13 ends of June 30th for all residents.

Schedule Selection for PGY2 and PGY3 takes place in late Winter (January/February) and is based on a lottery system by block. PGY1 schedules are selected as full 13-block schedules and based on military branch and resident preference.
