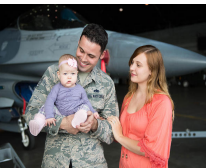




# NCC Pediatrics Continuity Clinic Curriculum: General Pediatrics Scavenger Hunt *Faculty Version*



## PART 1 (Complete Part 1 over lunch)

You are a single active duty E3. You have one 4 year old child and are pregnant with your second. You gave away all your infant stuff after the first one because you didn't think you would need it any more.

You make \$2,161.60 a month base pay, \$2355.00 BAH and \$406.98 BAS for a **total monthly income of \$4923.58**. You pay \$499 a month for child care on base, about to increase to \$923.15/month (15% multiple child reduction.) You pay \$1900/month for a one bedroom apartment and \$167/month for utilities. You have a monthly payment of \$318 a month to lease your Toyota Corolla. That leaves you approximately **\$1600 monthly for all other expenses**.

What purchases for your newborn are essential right now? Here is one [suggested list](#) or this more extensive one [here](#). What is missing? Would you remove anything?

Diapers, clothes, safe sleeping space, safe transportation. You might need bottles and small amount of formula, even if you plan to breastfeed. Pacifiers. What about 40% zinc oxide, saline nasal drops (both available through pharmacy), and a thermometer?

Your OB has provided you the paperwork to get your breast pump and supplies through TriCare.

Discuss cost-saving options such as foregoing bassinet for pack-n-play only, opting to go straight for convertible car seat instead of infant car seat.

What are other options/avenues for obtaining equipment/baby paraphernalia?

Army Emergency Relief, Coast Guard Military Assistance, Navy Marine Corps Relief Society, Air Force Aid Society are good resources. Options include can loans, "closets," and free layette programs, sometimes in exchange for taking a budgeting for baby class. Think about consignment shops, Goodwill for really good clothes for less money, Fleet and Family has a "basket" with coupons, etc .

What else do you think she should budget for after the newborn period?

Monthly, ongoing costs. Even if she goes on [WIC](#) (click on link to see WIC monthly food package)- other foods starting at 4-6 months, LOTS of diaper and wipes. Clothes in bigger sizes.

Bottles (baby will be in daycare). Wearable infant carrier, stroller. Baby books, toys.
